## CONTRACT

In 2016, members of Madres Sin Fronteras began advocating for a local ID, one that would grant members of our community, unable to access state-issued forms of identification, a reliable way to identify themselves to local law enforcement. These mothers and families recognized a local ID as an urgent need within our community. In order to address that need, the Human Rights Coalition of Alachua County has partnered with FaithAction International House, out of Greensboro, NC, to provide the **HRC Community ID card**.

The HRC Community ID card is for any resident in our community who may have limited access to government issued forms of identification. The ID will provide you with a verifiable form of identification, and help police officers and other community partners better serve and protect all residents. The ID additionally symbolizes your support of a diverse and inclusive community.

It is not a government issued ID and is not a license to drive. It does not give you a right to vote. It will not stop prosecution if you are engaged in an illegal activity, and it does not have any impact on an individual's present or future immigration status. The Gainesville Police Department and the Alachua County Sheriff's Office have expressed support of the program and may use the ID as a tool for law enforcement. The HRC Community ID card may or may not be accepted by other law enforcement agencies in Florida; it ultimately depends upon the policy of each department and the discernment of each officer. Other agencies such as schools, health centers and businesses may or may not accept the ID, again, depending on the policy of each institution.

In order to receive an HRC Community ID we require two pieces of original information (no copies or false information):

- ✂ **Proof of identification (passport, national ID card, matricula consular, driver's license from FL or another state)**
- ✂ **Proof of current address within the last three months (utility bill, lease agreement, bank statement, medical record, approved ID with address)**

We will hold this signed contract in a secure location at Westminster Presbyterian Church as proof of your attendance at this orientation. If you have met all of the necessary requirements and filled out your self-addressed envelope correctly, you should receive your ID card within 7-10 days. We will return your intake sheet to you in the mail along with your card – please keep this sheet as proof you have received an HRC Community ID card. Your HRC Community ID cannot be duplicated, and must be renewed after two years. Please contact us if your card has been lost or damaged. If your address changes at any time, you will need to contact us within 30 days of the move to make the appropriate changes or the ID will become invalid.

By signing this document you understand the purpose and limitations of the HRC Community ID, and have provided truthful information in order to secure the ID. If acquired or used fraudulently, your ID will be revoked. The Human Rights Coalition of Alachua County staff, board, or volunteers will not be held liable in any legal proceeding or immigration case.

Your HRC Community ID card will cost \$10 (cash only) and will include your photo, full name, address, date of birth, and expiration date, along with the HRC logo and contact information. The card will also clearly state that it is not a government issued form of identification.
